

Conflict of Interest Policy

The journal *Geodetski glasnik* is committed to maintaining the highest standards of integrity, transparency and objectivity in the publication process. In accordance with the principles and recommendations of the Committee on Publication Ethics (COPE), the journal requires the disclosure of any potential conflicts of interest that could influence, or be perceived to influence, the research, peer-review or editorial decision-making process.

Authors

All authors are required to disclose any potential conflicts of interest that could affect the interpretation of the results or the presentation of the manuscript.

Authors must include a Conflict of Interest statement in their manuscript at the time of submission. If no conflict of interest exists, authors should explicitly state: *“The authors declare that they have no conflict of interest.”*

Failure to disclose relevant conflicts of interest may result in rejection of the manuscript or retraction of a published article.

Reviewers and Editors

Despite the anonymity of the review process, reviewers must disclose any potential conflict of interest that could compromise their objectivity. Reviewers should decline the review if they believe they can identify the authors, or if they suspect that the manuscript originates from individuals, institutions or research groups with whom they have a personal, professional or financial relationship.

Editors are required to recuse themselves from handling manuscripts in which they have a conflict of interest. Editorial decisions must be based solely on the scientific merit and relevance of the manuscript.

Management of Conflicts of Interest

The editorial board of *Geodetski glasnik* will take appropriate steps to manage disclosed conflicts of interest in a transparent and responsible manner. When necessary, alternative editors or reviewers will be appointed to ensure the integrity and impartiality of the publication process.

Transparency and Compliance

Disclosure of conflicts of interest is an essential part of ethical scholarly publishing. The journal reserves the right to publish disclosed conflicts of interest alongside accepted articles when relevant. All participants in the publication process are expected to comply with this policy as a condition of submission, review and publication.
